who we are



TeachOut is a volunteer organisation that provides free tutoring to high school students in Cape Town's disadvantaged areas.

We are a student-run organisation at the University of Cape Town, with a committee of fifteen highly motivated students providing the administrative and organisational backbone to the project.

Our volunteer core consists of approximately 90 students and a few lecturers. Volunteers are typically undergraduate South African students, but we are increasingly involving foreign exchange students from the United States and Europe.

Established in 2003, TeachOut is part of an umbrella registered NPO, Ubunye. A cluster of four separate community service organisations – Township Debating League, Inkanyezi, TeachOut and the Media School – Ubunye provides its constituent members with administrative and logistical support.

By co-ordinating and grouping such tasks, the organisations are able to share resources and have a greater impact. The four projects are also able to learn from each other to improve their operations.

what we do

TeachOut provides weekly tutorial classes for high school learners in underprivileged areas of Cape Town.

Daily trips are made to schools where after-school classes are held for just over an hour.

Subjects covered include Maths, English, Functional English, Physical Science and Accounting, with volunteers selecting which subject they would prefer to tutor. Academic material is prepared by the committee and is modelled closely on the work learners will cover at school.

Around ten classes are held from Monday to Saturday, with volunteers departing from and returning to the University in hired transport.

We operate in three schools in the Cape Town area: Sophumelela and Zisukhanyo are in Samora Machel, and Christel House South Africa in Ottery.

We also provide afternoon tutorials for Yabonga's youth program. Yabonga is an organisation that empowers HIV-affected mothers and their children.

Statistics indicate that TeachOut has made a real impact in the schools in which it operates. Volunteers have consistently given us positive feedback about their involvement, and the teachers and learners are always appreciative and positive. In 2009, TeachOut was thrilled to welcome as a volunteer one of our former learners, Nonelela Pupuma, who started his degree in Accounting at UCT this year.

We aim to equip learners with the skills they need to do well academically, while instilling in the learners a love for learning and a passion for excellence.

TeachOut targets academic performance in Grades 8 to 12. Weekly tutorial sessions focus directly (Science, Maths, Accounting, English) and indirectly (Functional English) on learners' academics.

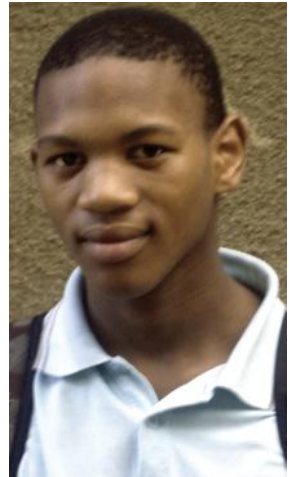
Volunteers also benefit from their involvement, by being given the opportunity to help those less fortunate than themselves, and gain valuable, tangible leadership experience by getting involved with the TeachOut Committee.

“ I was studying at a township school. It was kind of difficult, especially with maths and everything. So TeachOut helped me with Maths. They helped me to cement my knowledge and to make sure that my confidence and my IQ is actually quite whole. Because with Maths you could always ‘keep on trying, keep on trying’ and when you write tests you find that your results don’t actually reflect how much time you’ve put into it. But that’s just because you’re not so sure about what you’re doing. TeachOut just helped me to be sure of what I was doing and to actually give me more knowledge. ”

The committee strives to ensure that TeachOut adheres to the principles of a SMART project.

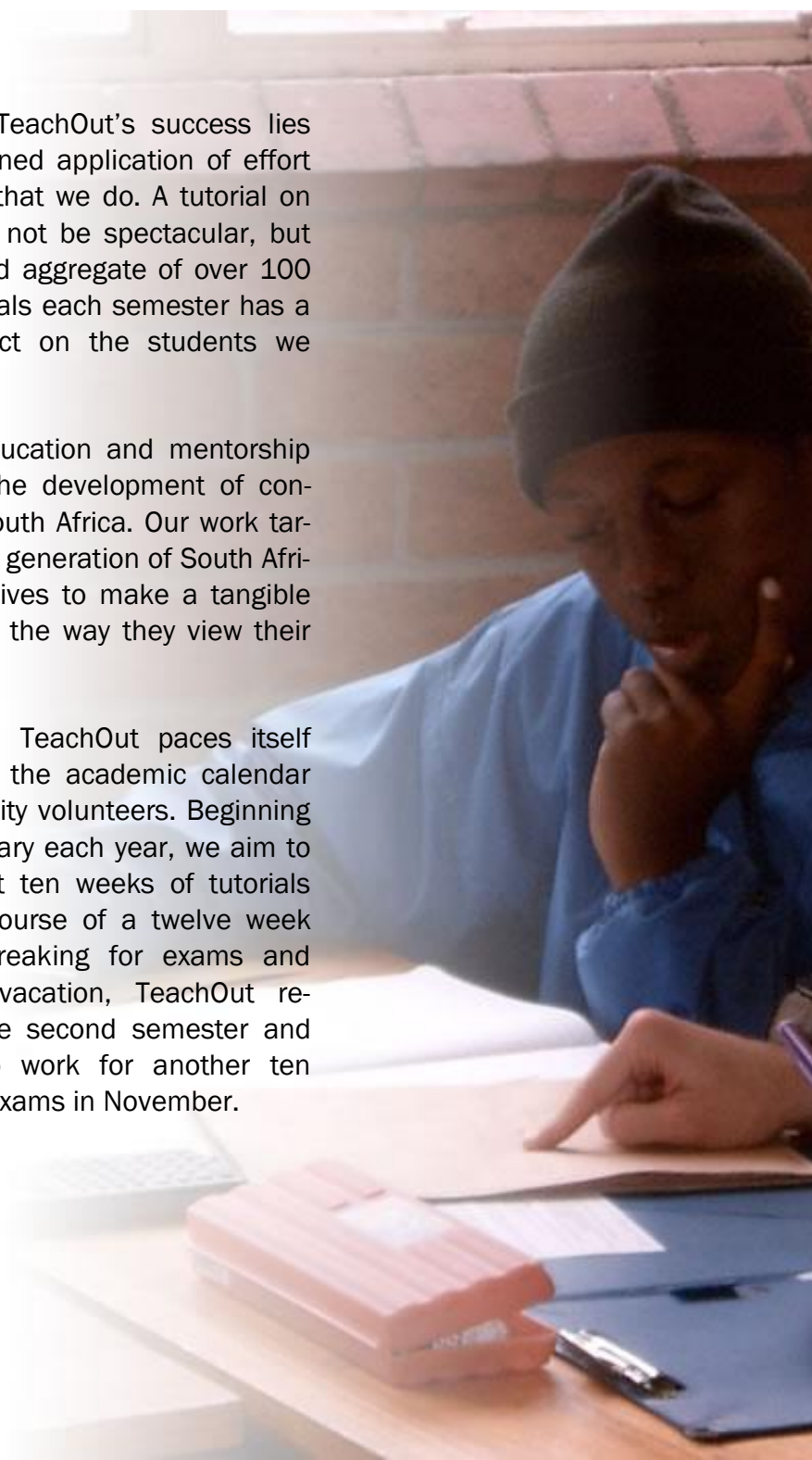
Specific. We are focused solely on providing education to needy high school students in three schools in Cape Town. We have built up a warm working relationship with staff at these schools and have come to know the material we tutor very well.

Achievable. TeachOut's success lies in the sustained application of effort to the work that we do. A tutorial on its own may not be spectacular, but the combined aggregate of over 100 weekly tutorials each semester has a lasting impact on the students we work with.

Relevant. Education and mentorship are key to the development of contemporary South Africa. Our work targets the next generation of South Africans and strives to make a tangible difference to the way they view their futures.

Time-framed. TeachOut paces itself according to the academic calendar of its university volunteers. Beginning in late February each year, we aim to hold at least ten weeks of tutorials during the course of a twelve week semester. Breaking for exams and the winter vacation, TeachOut resumes in the second semester and continues to work for another ten weeks until exams in November.
